Dear Parents/Guardians:

This letter is to inform you that there has been an increase of probable cases of the H1N1 flu reported throughout our school district. We are working with local and state health officials to monitor the situation, and, at this time, all schools—including Prospect High School— will remain open and continue operating normally.

Please keep your child home from school if he or she shows any flu-like symptoms, including a fever of 100 degrees or higher, cough, sore throat, body aches, headaches, chills, and fatigue, and **contact your health care provider and the school immediately.**

Students who come to school with flu-like symptoms will be evaluated by our nursing staff and separated from others until he or she can be sent home. Students with the flu should stay home until at least 24 hours after they no longer have a fever, or signs of a fever, without the use of fever-reducing medicines. Students who are ill will be allowed to make up missed classroom assignments. Simply contact your child's counselor and classroom teachers directly.

The best way to reduce the spread of H1N1 or any other virus is to practice good hygiene, and we ask you to remind your children to wash their hands often, keep their hands away from their eyes, nose, and mouth, and cover coughs and sneezes with their sleeve or a tissue. Let me assure you that the health and well-being of our students is our top priority, and we are doing what we can to address the situation. We will continue to work with our school nurse and the CCDPH to monitor any unusual patterns of illness. Updates will be provided on the school and district websites as the situation warrants.

Thank you for your continued support and for encouraging your child to take effective precautions in practicing good hygiene.
