Take advantage of discounted tuitions for Illinois students through the Midwest Student Exchange Program

Selected colleges and universities in neighboring states offer substantial tuition discounts through the Midwest Student Exchange Program. A few examples of discounted tuition are:

Remember that Private Colleges and Universities offer generous scholarships

When looking at the price tag of private schools, remember that large endowments allow them to grant significant merit scholarships, which can make their total cost rival public schools when combined with need-based financial aid. For example:
